



Dear Parents and Guardians,

I am doing a series of presentations during our chapel services for both elementary and upper school.

Using our theme verse of Romans 12:2, "Be transformed by the renewal of your mind", my goal is to teach our students that just because we feel something, that doesn't make it right. We are, in my opinion, living in a culture where feelings and emotions are ruling the day. If people feel angry, they blast others with their words or actions. If they feel anxious, they shut down and don't move forward. If people get offended because they feel hurt, they end relationships. Even to the extreme, that if a male feels like a female, he can identify as such and vice versa. This is crazy, upside down.

God's word teaches us that He created us with a mind, a brain, that is to govern our emotions. "A fool gives full vent to his spirit, but a wise man quietly holds it back." – Proverbs 29:11. Truth is supposed to reign over feelings. Truth is supposed to cause us to discipline things within ourselves. "When angry, do not sin; do not ever let your wrath (your exasperation, your fury or indignation) last until the sun goes down." Eph. 4:26

God created our emotions – and they are good, helpful, fruitful, create energy and compassion within us – but unbridled, they cause destruction to ourselves and others. Just like fire has so many positive uses and does so much for us – but out of control, it becomes destructive.

There is a fear in our society that to control our emotions or to teach our children to control their emotions (anxieties, fears, unhappiness, anger) is to suppress them. This is not true because suppression and being in control of our emotions are two very different things. Suppression denies the emotion whereas controlling our emotions acknowledges them and helps us learn how to express them in a healthy and appropriate way. I love hearing our elementary teachers calmly telling a student who is upset to "take a breath" (ie: get a hold of yourself) and then "use your words to tell say what is bothering you" (make a choice to express yourself in a healthy way).

I honored our high school and junior high when I spoke to them. They are doing a great job of appropriately controlling their emotions. We have quiet, cheerful hallways. We don't see fights, hear screaming or see aggression. Here at JCCS we want to equip our students so they consciously choose to let the Truth govern their feelings and their choices and have the words and wisdom to help their friends and neighbors. So needed today!!

One of the Fruits of the Spirit is Self-Control (Gal. 5:23). Let us purposely ask the Holy Spirit to help transform our culture back into one that actually lives by this grace.

In other news: Our seniors are working on their future plans including college, military and going into the work industry. Parents will be able to fill out the FAFSA beginning Dec. 1, 2024. Our collaboration with WVNCC is up and running with many more students now being able to take college classes. Juniors will be taking the ACT in March here at our school. The first quarter is behind us and we are ready to keep digging in!
